The Pain It Names

AI was supposed to save the day, but the cleanup spreads into every hour: context feeding, corrections, review, second guessing, and work nobody wants to own.

The Real Solution

This file turns hidden AI management into a visible control room with delegation levels, review labor tracking, output acceptance, and weekly agent retrospectives.

Research Position

Built from work-AI research on agents, human agency, and review labor: the main gain often comes from clearer operating rules, not more unattended automation.

The Control Room

AI does not remove management from work. It moves management closer to the task. Someone still has to decide the job, feed context, inspect the output, and own the result.

The control room turns that hidden labor into a visible workflow so AI speed does not leak into rework, confusion, or unchecked claims.

Delegation Ladder

- Level 1: retrieve and summarize source material.
- Level 2: draft from supplied facts.
- Level 3: compare options against criteria.
- Level 4: produce a work packet with assumptions marked.
- Level 5: recommend, but do not decide without human signoff.

Counterexample: Do It Manually

Some work should not be delegated. A sensitive customer reply, a final legal claim, a payment decision, or a brand-defining sentence may need human hands first.

Manual work wins when context is emotional, reputational, or legally sensitive. AI can still critique afterward, but it should not be the first voice in the room.

The Less-Walked Path

The common road automates tasks. The side road automates review.

This works when the team is already fast but sloppy. A source check, assumption scan, contradiction pass, or customer-language comparison can create more value than another draft.

1. Open this file beside one real problem.

5. Choose the next physical move: write, record, publish, call, invoice, review, delete, or wait.
